National Improving Writing Programme

FIRED UP about improving writing attainment at Curriculum for Excellence first level!


Wave I of the programme saw teams from Aberdeen City, Argyll & Bute, East Lothian, Perth & Kinross and Shetland work with the national team from CYPIC and Education Scotland. The 12 week programme supports participants to use Quality Improvement techniques alongside a writing change bundle to embed essential changes and maintain high quality delivery of writing. The bundle is based on good quality teaching and learning.

Key learning is that you can't compromise on any aspect of the bundle and applying a rigorous approach is having a transformational impact. Initial data on progress made by Wave 1 is shown below.

The best training I have ever done! True statement. It's a game changer. A truly meaningful and enjoyable programme which changed my tracking and raised attainment.

Each of the local authorities are now leading local cohorts to spread this theory of change (what we believe is needed to have these things happen reliably and consistently) in a systematic way and Wave 2 will begin recruiting this month!

Early Years

We are supporting colleagues working in early years services in a variety of ways, read on to find out more!

Out to Play in ELC - read the report!

Six teams worked with CYPIC and ELC Policy on an improvement programme focused on time spent undertaking outdoor learning and play in natural environments with a shared aim of all children in each of the settings spending at least half of their time outside by November 2021.

We recently published an evaluation of this work to help other settings consider how to increase the time they spend outdoors.

Participants reported benefits for children ...

"Visitors to the nursery now always comment how quiet the indoor space is and how engaged children are outdoors" Annick EYC "Freeflow to the outdoors is available all day now, high quality learning experiences are engaging children outdoors and we see this in our floorbooks" Newmilns ECC

... as well as benefits for staff

"You can see the difference in their mood and wellbeing, they want to be outdoors now" Flowerbank ECC

"During staff appraisals, the outdoors was mentioned as a positive aspect of life at Craighead, staff feel the benefit on a personal and professional level"

Stimulation and play


Nutrition

Whole family Wellbeing Funding

The first phase of the collaborative partnership work (Element 2 of the Whole family Wellbeing Funding) is underway with our three Children's Services Planning Partnerships (CSPP) – East Ayrshire, East Lothian and Glasgow City.

The National Support Team have been meeting with CSPP representatives from a range of services and initial discussions have focused on what transformational change will take place in order to best support children, young people and their families.

In East Lothian, a change team has been formed and is working alongside the national team to define their vision and understand their system.

In East Ayrshire, the team has been focusing on defining their vision and a series of Systems Mapping sessions have been planned to help identify priority areas for improvement. In all areas there is a team commitment to thinking differently and transforming family support.

The team are also working with Glasgow to explore their priorities for Family Support and to begin planning our joint work.
